
Citation Awarded To Harmon Potter



One plaque will be presented to Mr. Potter. A second plaque will hang in the lobby of Fauver Stadium alongside the other 14 winners.







Earned letters in four different sports at Wheatland-Chili High School: volleyball, softball, soccer, basketball . . . All-Conference in volleyball.
