Halftime to Fete All-Americans and Scholar-Athletes

All-Americans and Scholar-Athletes in a variety of sports will be recognized in halftime activities this afternoon.

Last year, three Rochester athletes won a total of five honors from the GTE Academic All-America Team as chosen by the College Sports Information Directors of America.

Those athletes are **Tanya Klebe** (women's volleyball), chosen as the Academic All-America of the Year for her sport and a First Team Academic All-American; **Andy Evans**, named First Team Academic All-American for cross country (fall sports, at-large) and for track & field (spring sports, at-large); **Bojan Zoric** (men's soccer), named Second Team Academic All-America for fall sports at-large.

The Memorial Citation is presented to a person for service to the intercollegiate athletic program.

The Scholar Award winners are: **Taya Branton** (women's basketball), **Larry Brown** (football), **Lori Chan** (women's lacrosse), **Laurie Kurtelawicz** (women's cross country/track & field), **Karan Raichand** (men's tennis), **Bob Versacci** (baseball).

The Citation Award is being presented to Brian Pasley '76, who has been an instrumental part of the Sports & Recreation Hall of Fame selection committee

and a vital part of the Garnish Scholarship Committee. He was inducted into the Hall of Fame in 1995.

Presentations for the awards will be made by members of the Garnish Committee, including Halford Johnson, Larry Palvino, and Pat Stark.
